# The Best Hotels and Suites In New York

These are the Big Apple's most enviable addresses.

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Nowhere is quite like New York.

The city that never sleeps is full of [Michelin-starred](#) restaurants, galleries, museums, and, crucially, [hotels](#) that not only hold their own against the best in the world, but consistently set international benchmarks for luxury.

### The Mark

A discreet alternative to the big-name grand dames, The Mark is on Madison Avenue at 77th Street, a few steps from Central Park and the Metropolitan Museum of Art (it's the 'getting ready' hotel of choice for those attending the Met Gala).

It has 106 rooms and 47 suites, and the interiors were designed by French designer Jacques Grange. There's a Jean-Georges restaurant, The Mark Bar, Caviar Kaspia at The Mark, a Frédéric Fekkai salon (in-suite appointments are available), and a 24-hour fitness center.

The hotel also has its own 70-ft Herreshoff sailing boat, one of the last of its kind. During the summer months, guests can embark on a two-hour sail around the New York Harbor while enjoying cuisine and cocktails by Jean-Georges Vongerichten.

#### Top suite to book: The Mark Penthouse

[The Mark Penthouse](#) is enormous — more than 10,000 sq ft spread across two floors, with a 2,500-sq-ft rooftop terrace overlooking Central Park and the Met. It has four fireplaces, five bathrooms, two powder rooms, two wet bars, gym, Augustinus Bader spa, and a cold plunge on the terrace.
